



The Fraternity of Saint Peter's
Saint Francis Xavier Mission invites you
to join their work in the Third World!



The primary goals of the Saint Francis Xavier Mission Trip are to instill in its participants a missionary spirit, a greater love for Christ and His Church and to provide them with an opportunity to assist the priests of the Fraternity in promoting a love for the Traditional Mass in places where it is not said.

In addition to bringing the beauty of tradition and the Extraordinary Form of the Mass to local villages, Saint Francis Xavier Missionaries will also work with the poor by performing a wide variety of corporal and spiritual works of mercy. The missionaries will contribute to the promotion of the traditional liturgy by singing at Mass, serving at the altar, and providing a clear example of faith and charity enriched by the sacred treasures of the Church. They will accompany the Fraternity priests as they perform pastoral and sacramental duties, and in so doing, they will witness first hand the beauty of our Faith.

EXPERIENCE THE UNIVERSAL CHURCH...

Additionally the "missionaries of St. Peter" will see in a unique way the universality of the Church, which is clearly visible in the traditional liturgy and devotions. A close hand experience, not only seeing poverty, but living it, will leave a lasting impression and give participants a renewed sense



of gratitude for what they have, and enlarge their sense of generosity. While working for others, sharing their deprivations, they will also share in the camaraderie of other traditional Catholics from across the country, creating memories that will last forever. It is our hope that the intense two weeks in a third world will be a life-changing experience.



WHAT TO EXPECT...

The parish of Santisimo Sacramento in Piura, Peru generously allows us to use one of their chapels for Mass and prayers. Each day will begin with the Tridentine Mass, followed by a brief thanksgiving and breakfast. The missionaries will then be divided into smaller groups with chaperons and will receive work assignments for the morning. After the morning work, the missionaries will gather together again for lunch and a break before resuming our work in the afternoon. Evenings will bring everyone together again for the rosary and a spiritual reflection before dinner and the sharing of stories and recreation after dinner. Public Masses will



witness to the beauty of the traditional liturgy and will enable us to introduce it to the local people. Missionaries will help the locals enter into the sacred mysteries by singing Gregorian Chant and traditional hymns and by showing them the appropriate gestures during Mass.

The trip will conclude with a pilgrimage to Lima to venerate the saints who lived and are buried there.

WHO CAN GO?

Mexico: Families & children 16 and up

Peru 1st Week: Ages 16-21, boys & girls

Peru 2nd Week: Men & women ages 21 and up

Participants must provide letters of recommendation and be interviewed by seminarians or priests of the Fraternity.

The Sisters from Morning Star Camp, the Slaves of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, will be accompanying the girls attending the trip in July.
